This mind changer activity shall help interest in and reflect upon the different aspects of diversity and see also how HR managers / company owners may understand the situation in their life and work. It shall be an initiator to rethink any discrimination.

Mind changer implementation and follow-up – For VET providers

Step 01

Prepare

Group discussion about the difficulties migrants face in a host country.

Step 02

Implement

Each participant will write down on a piece of paper one difficulty, either according to their experience or to what they have heard. They put it in a box, and the trainer mixes the content of the box.

Step 03

Develop

Each participant pulls out one paper, reads it aloud, and tries to find a solution to the problem.

Step 04

Follow-up

Further discussion on each problem and its solution is encouraged.

Recommendations, Tips & Hints

The participants should consider that natives may face the same problems as migrants, but the solution may not be the same. What role does discrimination play in this?
